

TSU moves up to 4th overall in SUC III Olympics 2016

After years of staying in the middle spot, Tarlac State University reached 3rd runner-up or 4th overall in the recent SUC III Olympics 2016, hosted by the Pampanga State Agricultural University on January 21-27, 2017.

13 State Universities and Colleges competed in this year's Olympics. Bulacan State University remained on top, holding the overall championship for the past 20 years now.

According to Dr. Ligaya S. Salangsang, Head of the TSU Sports Development and Management Unit, this success was attained through lots of preparation and support from the TSU Administration.

Several adjustments and changes were made during the past year, from the year-round training to classifying teams according to their performance.

Teams in winnable sports were prioritized, while others, dubbed as "training teams" or "Team Bs", were given training time until they qualified for the annual event. This enabled officials to maximize the strength of our competing teams and athletes.

Notably, this year's performance has brought the most number of golds in the history of TSU. 32 TSUians will join the SCUAA III (Central Luzon) delegation for the National SUC Olympics.

Dr. Norbina Genever M. Castro, the associate dean of the College of Education (COEd), received Excellent Paper Award from the International Society for Engineering Research and Development (ISERD) for the category Best Presentation/Best Content on January 5, 2017 for the paper that she presented titled "Classroom Learning Environment at Tarlac State University – College of Education" in the 59th ISERD International Conference held in Sydney, Australia on January 4 – 5, 2017.

In the said international conference, two other faculty from the college also presented their research papers successfully. Among them were Dr. Felicitas A. Quilondrino for her paper "State of the Art of Technical Education and Skills Development (TESD) Programs of State Universities and Colleges in Region III and Dr. Ma. Theresa A. Acosta for her paper "The Extension Program of Teacher Education Institution among State Universities and Colleges in Region

The conference aimed to promote cooperation among scientists, defend scientific freedom, encourage scientific responsibility, and support scientific education and science outreach for the betterment of all humanity.
